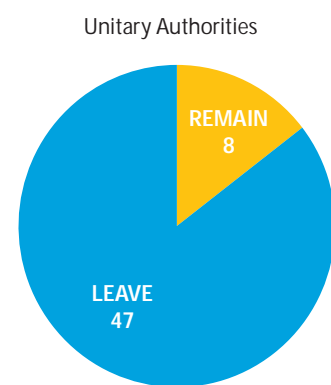
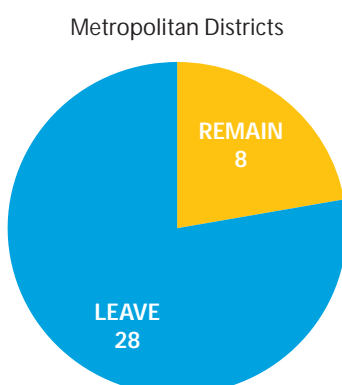
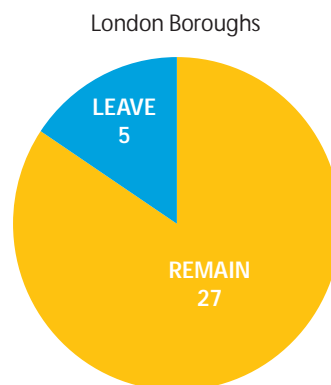
HIGHLIGHTS!

- Predominantly rural areas (and the people living in them) were the most likely to vote leave. Predominantly mixed areas followed close behind, and predominantly urban areas were the least likely by a large margin.
- People living in London boroughs were the most likely to vote remain (65.1%). Only 16% of London boroughs voted to leave.
- People living in Metropolitan districts were the most likely to vote leave (56.6%).
- In total, unitary authority areas were the most likely to vote leave (85%)
- Areas in the West Midlands (97%), and the people living there (60.3%), were the most likely to vote leave. They were followed closely behind by people in North East and East Midlands.

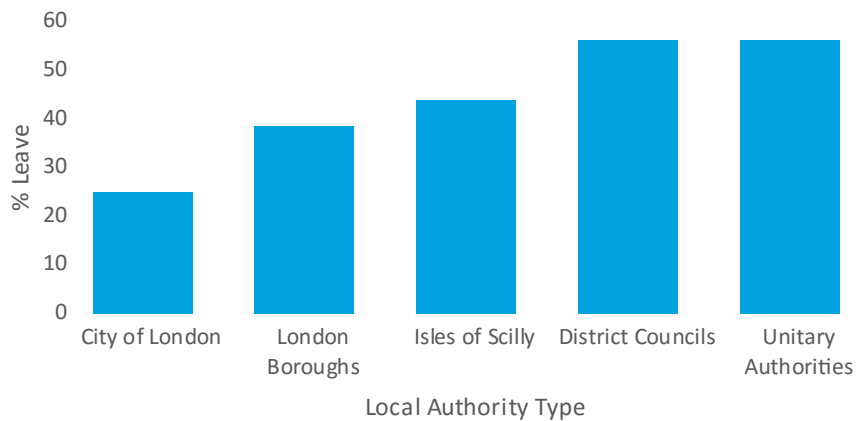
ON URBAN/RURAL DIVIDE

- On average (mean), 56.0% of people in predominantly rural areas voted to leave. Out of 91 rural areas, 14 voted to remain (15%) and 77 (85%) voted to leave.
- On average (mean), 56.0% of people in predominantly mixed areas voted to leave. Out of 54 mixed areas, 12 voted to remain (22%) and 54 voted to leave (78%).
- On average (mean), 53.3% of people in predominantly urban areas voted to leave. Out of 181 urban areas, 55 voted to remain (30%) and 126 voted to leave (70%).

ON REGION

- **WEST MIDLANDS:** 60.3% of people voted to leave. Out of 30 areas, 1 (3%) voted to remain and 29 (97%) voted to leave.
- **NORTH EAST:** 59.5% of people voted to leave. Out of 12 areas, 1 (8%) voted to remain and 11 (92%) voted to leave.
- **EAST MIDLANDS:** 59.2% of people voted to leave. Out of 40 areas, 3 (8%) voted to remain and 37 (93%) voted to leave.
- **YORKSHIRE AND THE HUMBER:** 58.7% of people voted to leave. Out of 21 areas, 3 (14%) voted to remain and 18 (86%) voted to remain.
- **EAST:** 57.0% of people voted to leave. Out of 47 areas, 5 (11%) voted to remain and 42 (89%) voted to leave.
- **NORTH WEST:** 55.9% of people voted to leave. Out of 39 areas, 7 (18%) voted to remain and 32 (82%) voted to leave.
- **SOUTH WEST:** 53.7% of people voted to leave. Out of 37 areas, 9 (24%) voted to remain and 28 (76%) voted to leave.
- **SOUTH EAST:** 52.2% of people voted to leave. Out of 67 areas, 24 (36%) voted to remain and 43 (64%) voted to leave.
- **LONDON:** 39.1% of people voted to leave. Out of 33 areas, 28 (85%) voted to remain and 5 (15%) voted to leave
