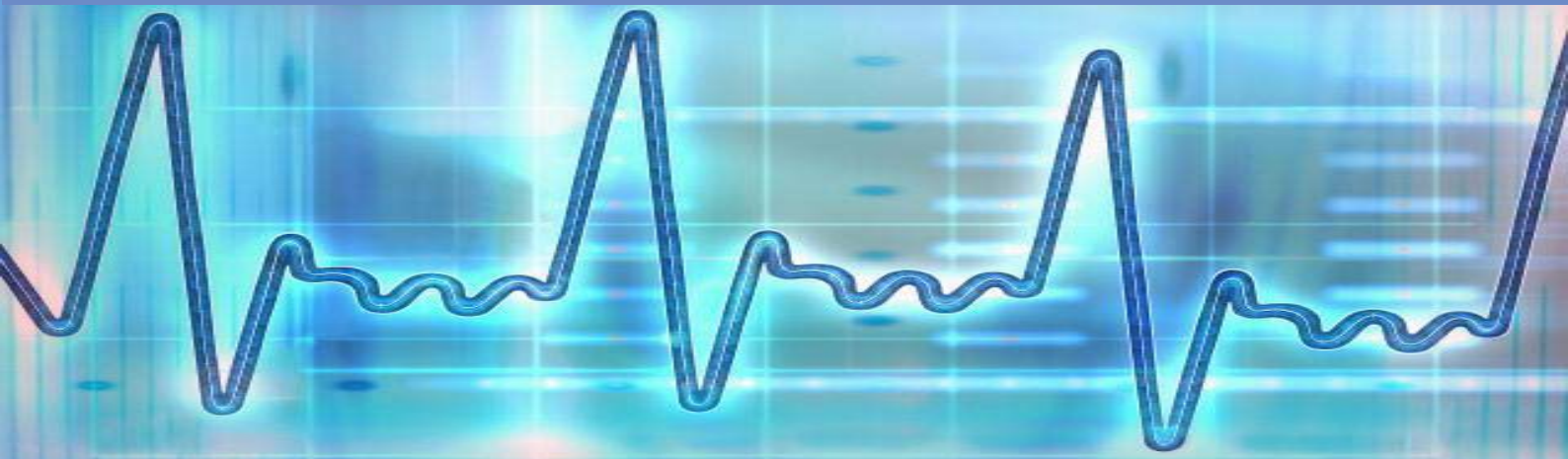


Driving health care provision through strengthening local partnerships:

How the local government White Paper can deliver better health outcomes



The local government White Paper sets out how the Government intends to strengthen local partnerships between councils and the NHS, to tackle the social and economic causes of poor health and improve the delivery of health care and other related services.

These plans will also enable authorities to show how their own plans link with those of other public and community agencies where there is shared responsibility to meet the needs of local people, for example Health Improvement Programmes.

This timely half-day seminar will explore how the new provisions in the White Paper will allow local authorities and regional bodies to work strategically with local NHS providers to drive better health outcomes.

This event will bring together key stakeholders in health policy from the public and private sectors and from the local government community to debate how to develop working partnerships between citizens, their local council and primary care trusts to deliver improved health outcomes and provide citizens with the necessary opportunities to meet their needs and aspirations.
